

Key Instant Recall Facts

Year 1 – Spring 2

I know number bonds to 10.

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts **instantly**.

0 + 10 = 10	2 + 8 = 10	4 + 6 = 10
10 + 0 = 10	8 + 2 = 10	6 + 4 = 10
10 - 10 = 0	10 – 8 = 2	10 - 6 = 4
10 - 0 = 10	10 – 2 = 8	10 – 4 = 6
1 + 9 = 10	3 + 7 = 10	5 + 5 = 10
9 + 1 = 10	7 + 3 = 10	10 – 5 = 5
10 – 9 = 1	10 – 7 = 3	
10 – 1 = 9	10 – 3 = 7	

<u>Key Vocabulary</u>	
What is 3 add 2?	
What is 2 plus 2?	
What is 5 take away 2?	
What is 1 less than 4?	

They should be able to answer these questions in any order, including missing number questions e.g. $6 + \bigcirc = 10$ or $10 - \bigcirc = 3$.

<u>Top Tips</u>

The secret to success is practising **little** and **often**. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey? You don't need to practise them all at once: perhaps you could have a fact of the day. If you would like more ideas, please speak to your child's teacher.

<u>Use practical resources</u> – Your child has one potato on their plate and you give them two more. Can they predict how many they will have now?
